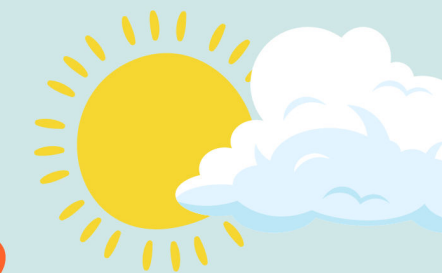

It's Time to Count the Omer!

“

Leviticus 23:15-16 says,

“FROM THE DAY AFTER THE SABBATH, THE DAY YOU BROUGHT THE SHEAF OF THE WAVE OFFERING, COUNT OFF SEVEN FULL WEEKS. COUNT OFF FIFTY DAYS UP TO THE DAY AFTER THE SEVENTH SABBATH, AND THEN PRESENT AN OFFERING OF NEW GRAIN TO YAHUAH.”

What is the Omer?

The Omer is like a little box of grain that people used to bring as a "thank you" to Elohim.

What is Counting the Omer?

Counting the Omer is like counting up to the Appointed Time of Shavuot! We start the day after a rest day called the Sabbath, during the Feast of Unleavened Bread, and count for 50 days.

How Do We Count?

Every night, we say which day it is, like "Today is one day," then "Today is two days," up to 50 days, until Shavuot arrives!

1) Find your square: Today's date is today's square number.

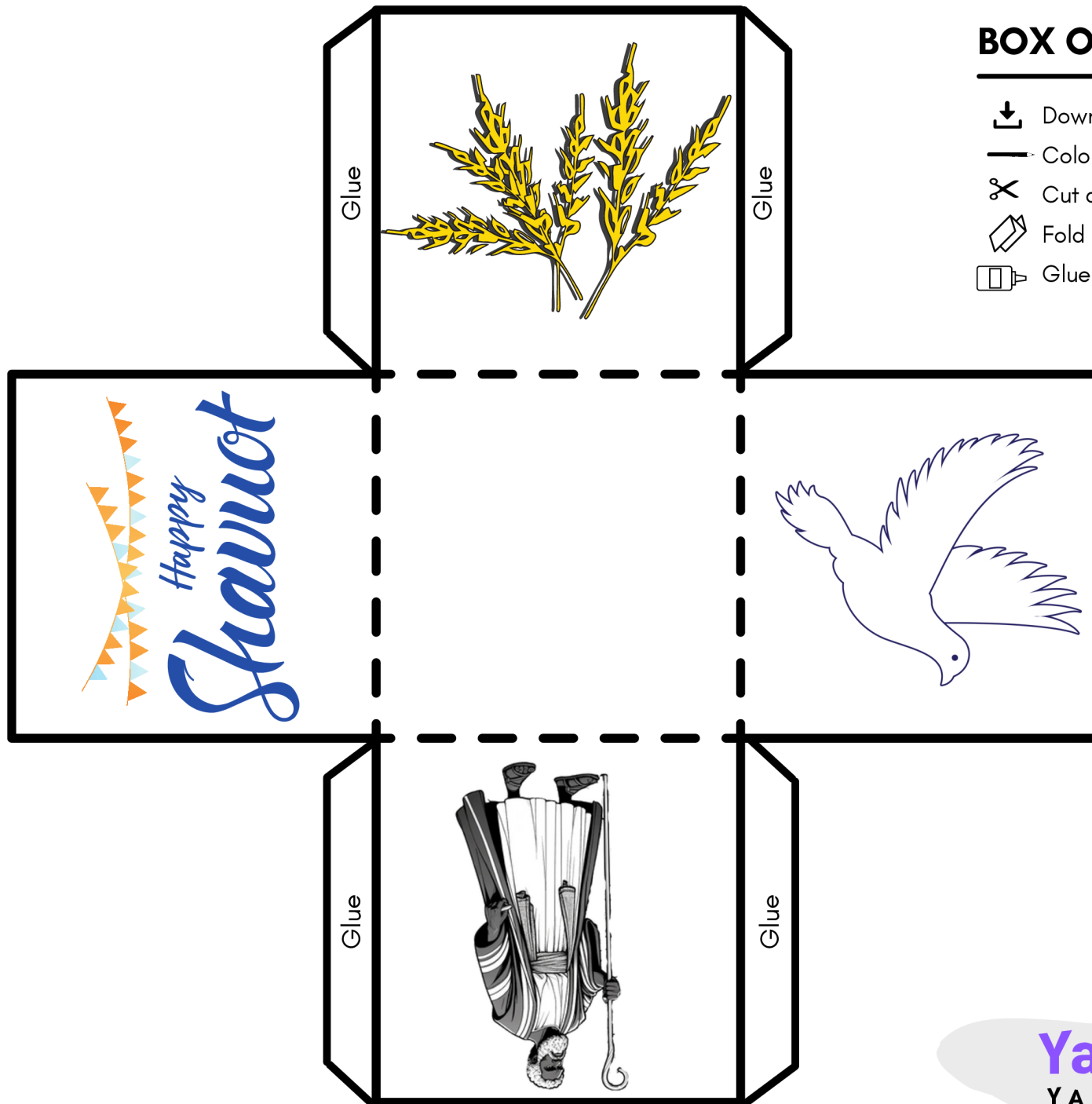
Start at 1 and go up to 50!

2) Color it in: Pick a color and fill in today's square.

3) Keep going every day: Do this daily until you reach square 50, and that means it's Shavuot! Happy coloring!

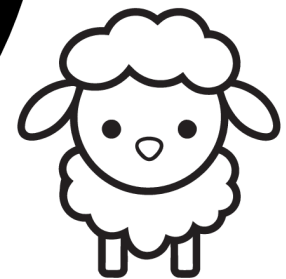
What does the word "Shavuot" mean?

The word Shavuot means "weeks." Another name for Shavuot is Feast of Weeks & some call it Pentecost. It's an appointed time after we count seven weeks, or 49 days, starting right after Passover. The next day, the 50th, is Shavuot!

→ Inside the 50, draw 50 omers (little boxes of grain).

Days Until Shavuot, also known as the Feast of Weeks

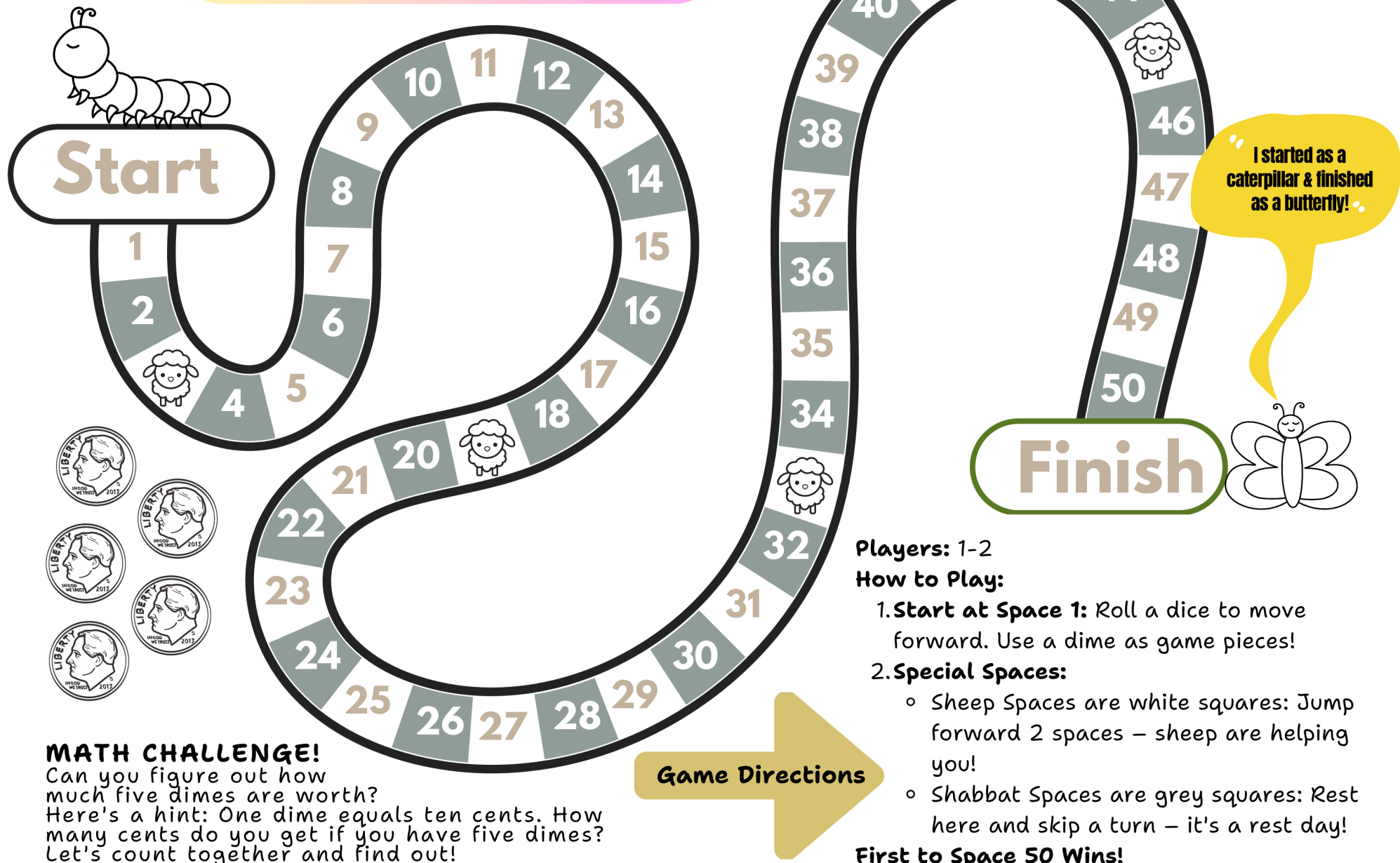

2. **Special Spaces:**

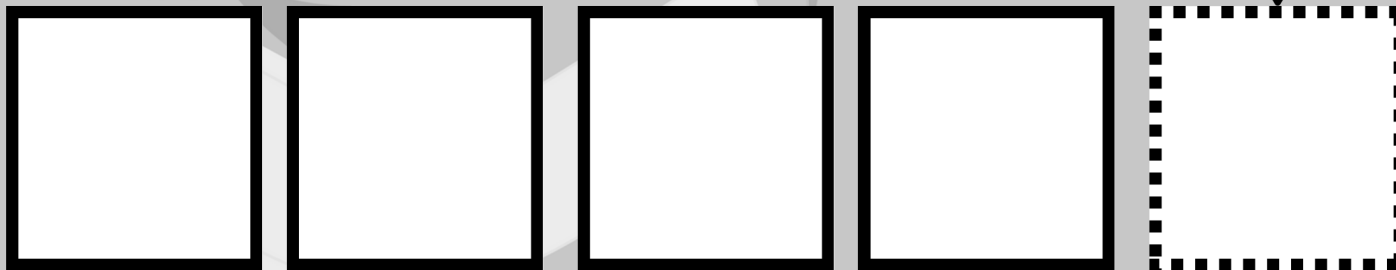
- Sheep Spaces are white squares: Jump forward 2 spaces – sheep are helping you!

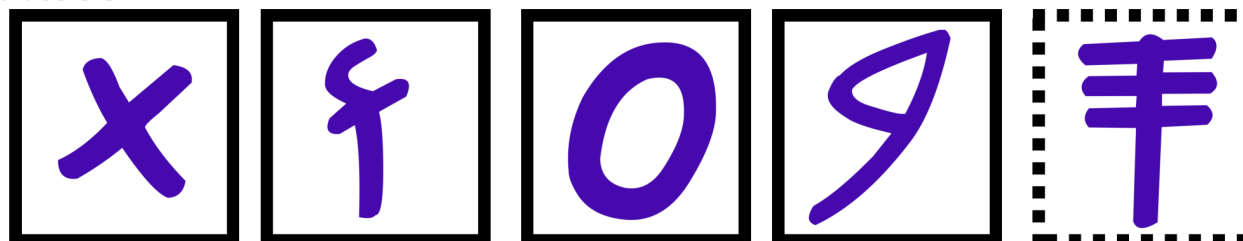

This is how people write Hebrew today. It looks neat and smooth!

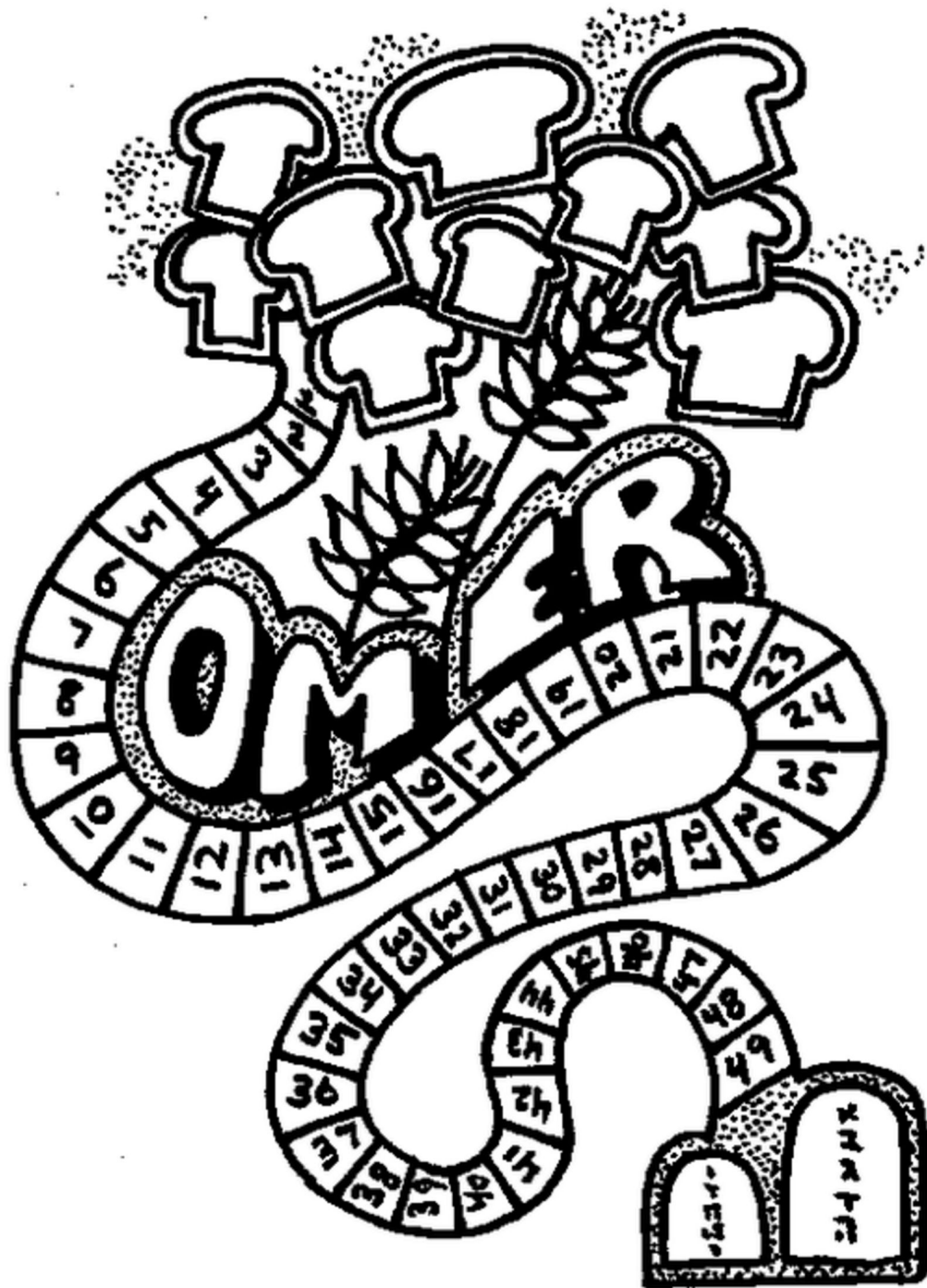
Paleo Script:

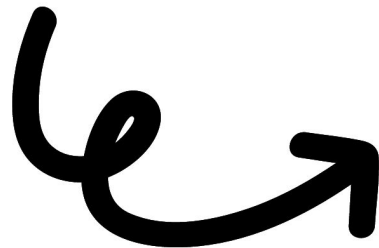

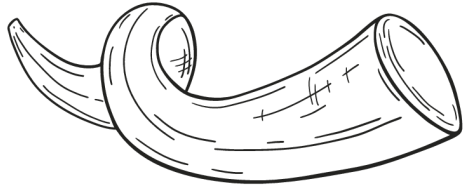
What is Moses doing in this picture?

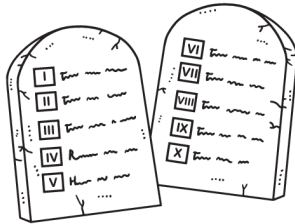

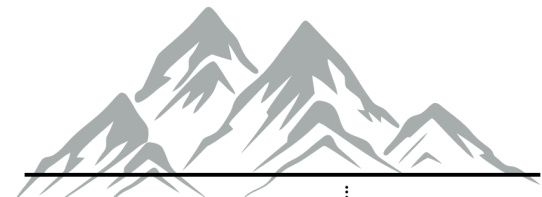
